

Vaughn Doody



Vaughn started bowling in 1960 at Windsor Locks in Connecticut. He moved to Las Vegas in 1990 and bowled in several leagues each year.

His average was over 220 most years with a high average of 239.

In the 1989 Showboat Camaro Classic Tournament he won a Camaro.

He bowled a 299 game in the position round to win the P.B.A. Senior Regional Tournament in Bullhead City, Arizona.

The S.A.S.B.A club from Texas held two tournaments in Las Vegas and he won \$15,000 in the first one which was held at the showboat. The following year the tournament was held at the Orleans and he finished second while winning \$5,000.

Vaughn won \$5,000 while competing in the True Amateur Ebonite Challenge classic held at Texas Station.

At the Mini-Eliminator held at the Orleans he made the TV finals and finished fourth winning \$15,000.

He has bowled in over 100 High-Roller Tournaments amassing over \$200,000 dollars. Those tournaments were held at the Showboat and Sam's Town.

Vaughn bowled in more than 200 tournaments on the West Coast Senior Tour. He won 33 titles and was voted bowler of the year 7 times. He won 15 titles on the Southern California Senior tour and 2 more on the Northern California Senior tour. He bowled ABC - USBC National Tournaments for 27 years.

In 1989 and 1991 he went to Ireland on Good Will Bowling trips. He taught classes and bowled in tournaments with Irish bowlers.
