### Janet Tonelli

Meritorious Service

Janet Tonelli was born in Indiana. She and Bob Tonelli, her husband of 38+ years, moved to Henderson, Nevada in 2000, where they immediately became local association members.



Janet was an officer in the Henderson Women's Bowling Association from 2000 to 2005.

Shortly after the merger of ABC/WIBC to USBC in 2005, and the local associations merger to form the Southern Nevada USBC Association, she was elected to the SNUSBCA Board of Directors, and has served on that board for 18 years and counting.

She was appointed to the Awards Committee and later was appointed Chairwoman of that committee, a position she continues to hold as of this writing in 2023. Around 2008, she was asked to Chair the Board's Finance Committee, and remains active in that position as well.

Her passion for the success of our association is coupled with her volunteering to work at the SNUSBCA office most every week and, during the busy sanctioning time, often up to three days a week.

Janet Tonelli is a smiling face you get to meet as she works most every association tournament, doing on-site sign ups and recording scores. Gary Gabriel Meritorious Service

Gary Gabriel began his love for bowling as a teenager, when he bowled on the Bonanza High School team.

Shortly after turning 17, he rolled his first 300 game at the infamous Charleston Heights Bowl. Two days later, he rolled another 300 game at the

equally infamous West Hill Lanes. Not long after, he scored yet another 300 in a PBA Regional Tournament at the world renown Showboat Lanes. Gary was quickly making a name for himself, and has earned two Presidential Awards for his bowling talent.

Among his greatest accomplishments as an adult, Gary earned an Eagle for Team All-Events in the 1991 USBC National Tournament in Toledo. Ohio.

He also rolled another 300 game in the SNUSBCA City Tournament at the Suncoast Bowling Center. To date, Gary has amassed twenty 300 games and "only" two 299's - which means he mostly gets the job done on the 12th shot!

Gary has bowled three or four leagues a season for his entire adult life, and has a huge sense of pride and leadership in the sport, and because of his dedication to his leagues, he has never missed a night of bowling for health reasons.

When the new Suncoast Bowling Center opened in 2000, Gary saw an opportunity to enter yet another facet of the sport that has since become a passion and a hallmark for what made Gary Gabriel a viable candidate for the Hall of Fame.

He formed the Monday Night Men's league at the Suncoast and was immediately elected League Secretary for the first time. His dedication, expertise and attention to detail soon landed him another position as Secretary of the Budweiser Tuesday Night Scratch league.

Gary is the consumate secretary. He takes the job very seriously, assuring all the rules are followed, all the money is where it's supposed to be, and awards are secured for all bowlers that earn them. No one was greatly surprised when Gary Gabriel was awarded the SNUSBC Association Secretary of the Year for Large Leagues in 2014.

Gary was offered a position at the K&K Pro Shop at the Suncoast. He was in bowling heaven. By day, he would drill bowling balls, and in the evenings he would continue to post high scores and serve as a truly exemplary league secretary - attributes and opportunities that are afforded so very few. League bowlers, tournament bowlers and bowling center staff members and managers have great admiration for Gary as a secretary and a top player.

# Eric Forkel Superior Performance

Anyone who has followed bowling over the last few decades will certainly know the name of Eric Forkel.

Born and raised in California, Eric learned at an early age that he had the knowledge and talent to be competitive on the Professional



Bowlers Tour, and proved it by winning five PBA National titles, and from 1992 to 2016, he won 27 PBA Regional titles. He is the holder of one PBA Major title - the 1992 PBA National Championship.

His last title was a memorable one, not only for him, but for PBA fans around the globe. He won the very first ever outdoor PBA event - the 1999 NYC Experience held in Bryant Park in Manhattan.

He is credited with posting more than 75 300 games and more than 25 series of 800 or better. He set a record of ABC/USBC National events with an impressive 874 series in the 1997 ABC Masters.

He twice made the list of the Bowler's Journal All-American Team. It's no wonder Eric Forkel was elected to the Los Angeles Bowling Hall of Fame and the Southern California Bowling Hall of Fame.

After leaving the Tour full time, Eric moved to Southern Nevada and became a member of the local association in 2004. Needless to say, he continued to bowl his way into area stardom by winning the Nevada State Masters senior division title six times, which earned him entries into the national USBC Masters Tournaments.

In the prestigious Southern Nevada Bowlers Tour (SNBT), Eric has amassed 26 titles, the second most of all time since the series began.

In the Southern Nevada City Tournaments, Eric won the 2008 and 2011 Scratch All-Events titles. As a league bowler, his highest average was an impressive 246 in the 2019-20 season.

Even after turning age 50, Eric has not slowed down. In 2021, he won the prestigious Southern Nevada Senior Masters Division I.

Eric Forkel is a USBC Certified Bronze Coach, and with his work with fitting and drilling bowling balls for players of all levels as an employee of Bowlersmart in Las Vegas, he is eager and willing to offer guidance and valuable information to help bowlers improve their games.
